House Rules

1. Must have either a \$15.00 or \$20.00 book to play bingo or buy tips

2. Must have the **last number** called as part of the winning bingo. One ball must be called between the single and double bingo, and you must have that number on your card for the double bingo.

- 3. It is the player's responsibility to ensure the caller is notified of any potential winning card before the next ball is called. Should the next number be called causing a card to not have the last number called as part of the winning pattern, the player will not be paid (see item 2). Exception: if a bingo **WORKER** hears and verifies that the player made an attempt to notify the caller of a winning card, the bingo player will be paid provided the player had a winning card. Should multiple winners occur as a result of the caller calling the next ball, then the winners will be played equally.
- 4. Must be at least 16 years old to play bingo and 18 years to purchase or play tips. Must have id.

5. NO check or credit cards accepted. There is an ATM for your convenience.

6. No bingo prizes paid after game is closed.

7. Daubers must be used for all bingo paper.

8. Winner name and address must be provided and legible on admission papers, for prizes to be paid.

9. All instant tip winners must be claimed on the day the game is played. Holder tickets will be held for a minimum of 30 calendar days following completion of the game. Late holders may be paid in check form. Any unclaimed prizes become the property of Boyce Volunteer Fire Company.

10. No single bingo papers will be sold after the start of the game.

- 11. A maximum of one winning pattern will be honored per card. Multiple card sheets may have multiple winners as long as the winners are on different cards.
- 12. The BVFC reserves the right to reduce payout based upon total attendance when the attendance for any session is less than 100. ***A minimum of 50 players must attend to play***
 - 75 to 100 \$100 games go down to \$80, \$200 games go to \$160, Jackpot to \$800
 - 50-75 \$100 games go down to \$50, \$200 games go to \$100, Jackpot goes to \$500
 - Under 50 BVFC has the right to cancel bingo and will refund any book/paper in original conditions – this means NO TAPE OR DAUBED PAPERS
- 13. The decision of the bingo manager for bingo session is final. If you are dismissed from the bingo hall, there will be no refunds.

14. Seats may only be saved if an admission pack (6-on or 9-on) has been purchased for the player

- 15. Any paper purchased but not played during a session must be discarded. Unused paper may not be used during future sessions. No refunds for unused paper will be made once that game has started. No partial refunds on books for games not played during a session.
- 16. Any damage you do to your books or papers, such as exploding daubers, spilled drink, ripped paper etc., is your responsibility. We will not replace the games for free.

Example 1:

Player "A" yells bingo on O69 but the caller does not hear the player yell bingo. The caller then calls O70 and Player "B" yells bingo. When verified the Player "A" had a good pattern on O69, but O70 is not part of the winning pattern. Player "B" had a winning pattern on O70. If no bingo worker can verify that Player "A" yelled bingo prior to the caller calling O70, then Player "B" would be paid the entire prize money and Player "A" would receive no prize. However, if a bingo worker verifies that Player "A" made a legitimate attempt to notify the caller prior to the caller calling O70, then both winning cards would be honored and each player would receive half the prize money.

Example 2:

While playing a single bingo game two players bingo on B15. The first player has a straight-line bingo on a single card. The second player has a straight-line bingo on a single card plus a postage stamp on the same card. Since only one winner is paid per card, each player receives half of the prize.

Example 3

While playing a single bingo game two players bingo on B15. The first player has a straight-line bingo on a single card. The second player has a straight-line bingo on a single card plus a postage stamp on another card on the same sheet of paper. Since there are three winning cards, the prize will be divided three ways with the first player receiving 1/3 of the prize and the second player receiving 2/3 of the prize.
